Introduction

This release of QAD Demand and Delivery is a General Availability (GA) release. Review this document before proceeding with any phase of an implementation.

Release Summary

Customers are encouraged to work closely with their QAD Customer Success manager or Helpdesk to learn more about the selection, implementation, and use of new and upgraded capabilities for their specific business requirements.

Web Browsers Supported

The user interface is only supported on current versions of the Chrome, Safari, and Edge web browsers (Chrome 91+, Safari 12+, and Edge 97). Although you can use other web browsers, you may encounter differing levels of performance and user experience. Some functionality may not be available.

Tablets Supported

For tablet use, the user interface is only supported on iPad Pro or newer equivalent running iOS 11+. Although you can use other tablets, you may experience differing levels of performance and user experience.

Tablet Usage Guidelines

Note the following guidelines for using QAD Demand and Delivery on a touchscreen tablet.

- QAD Demand and Delivery is optimized for landscape mode. Most tablets in portrait mode are not wide enough to fit all of the fields and full menu.
- For data entry tasks, an external keyboard is highly recommended.
 - If you are using the tablet's virtual keyboard, consider using an alternative keyboard app for improved functionality and view area usage.
 - If you are using the tablet's virtual keyboard, use the tablet's settings to make the keyboard smaller so that it does not cover too much of the view area.
 - On some tablets, the virtual keyboard can obscure the view area, especially when used in landscape mode.
- On a tablet, QAD Demand and Delivery views do not offer a hybrid mode where you can access browse and form data simultaneously.
- It is best to configure views and stored views on a larger desktop or laptop screen.
- Double-click actions are not supported on tablets.
- Hover events are not supported on tablets.
- The browse grouping (Group By) feature is not yet available for tablet use.

Note: Although the Surface Pro has a touchscreen, QAD Demand and Delivery works on the Surface Pro as it does with regular laptop and desktop devices. These interaction guidelines do not apply to the Surface Pro.

Note: Windows 10 can automatically scale displays by 150% for high-resolution screens. For best results, change the automatic 150% scaling factor to be from 100% to 125%.

Performance Guidelines

On a tablet, for performance reasons, open no more than five levels deep of drill-down modal dialogs. If you need to drill down more than five levels deep, open the next drill-down modal dialog in a new browser tab.

For high-speed broadband connection performance, the following specifications are recommended:

- Minimum download speed 16 mbps
- Maximum latency 150 ms

New Feature

End-of-Day Schedules

- There are two new fields on the Schedules panel in Company Maintenance.
 - The End of the Day field enables you to create a policy for receiving schedule orders from different time zones each day. Specify a time in the customer time zone in the format hh:mm (hour:minute). This is the cut-off time for the customer to place a schedule order that will be shipped or delivered according to the schedule date. This time is applied to the schedule when no time zone is provided. For example, a supplier is in Germany and the customer is in New York. If the cut-off time for receiving the order is 22:00 in Germany, the cut-off time in New York is 16:00. Therefore, the time in the field is 16:00.
 - The Active checkbox indicates if the End of the Day policy is active. When you select the Active field, the time in the End of the Day field is applied where there is no time zone on the schedule details. This field is selected by default for new subscriptions.

Release Fixes

QAD Demand and Delivery includes the following fixes:

- Previously, there was an error when selecting labels for updating in Company Maintenance or Suppliers. This issue is fixed.
- When you ran the poller, it was displaying an error for in-transit ASNs. This issue is fixed.
- Schedule Release Consolidated Alerts were not being sent. This issue is fixed.
- An issue where suppliers were not able to edit user-defined fields in Demand and Delivery is fixed.
- For Min Max, suppliers were not able to edit user-defined fields. This issue is fixed.
- An issue where ASN header details were not reflected in the SNF file is fixed.
- An issue with incorrect ship times in the SNF file is fixed.
- An error occurred when using the same schedule order on different ASN lines in the same ASN, preventing the user from saving and creating the ASN. This issue is fixed.
- Min/Max user-defined Supplier Read-Only Fields were not displaying properly. This issue is fixed.
- Genload was failing for customers where the OrganizationPolicy record was not available. This issue is fixed.
- When GenIP was executed, the POLine tag was not extracted in the xml file. This issue is fixed.
- Invoice user-defined fields were not loading to the Demand and Delivery portal when there was no purchase order linked to the invoice. This issue is fixed.
- Customer administrator users were not able to get full access to the supplier user account when Restrict Suppliers to Create was selected in Company Maintenance. This issue is fixed.
